<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ A crop that is grown specifically to be sold, not for use by the farmer. ○ These crops often become the biggest money maker in a colony or country. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ ex) tobacco 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Plant introduced to the settlers in Jamestown by the Native Americans. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ It became hugely popular in Europe.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The practice of owning another person. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ People who paid for their trip to the colonies by agreeing to work for someone for a number of years.
